

When you want to make a sentence in English, remember this sequence:

SVOMPT

Ryan watches sci-fi movies.

I work in London from Monday to Thursday.

Luke goes cycling on the hills every Saturday.

The dog chases squirrels happily in the park every afternoon.



S is the **subject**: I, you, he, they, Ryan, Elisabeth, ...

V is the **verb**: go, goes,
work, works ...

O is the **object**: sci-fi movies, squirrels, tennis...

M is the **manner**: fast, slowly, beautifully,
badly, happily, sadly, ...

P is the **place**: at the airport, in the park,
in London, at work, on the hills, ...

T is the **time**: today, in the evening, at night,
at 9 o'clock, every Thursday, twice a day...



Remember:

Adverbs of frequency do not follow this rule; they go **before** the main verb and **after** the verb to be:

*I **always** go to sleep early.*

*I am **always** late.*

ALWAYS: sempre

USUALLY: di solito

OFTEN: spesso

SOMETIMES: a volte

HARDLY EVER: quasi mai

NEVER: mai
